Ice cream and ice milk may be kept up to two months if stored at 0°F or below. A tightly closed carton prevents drying, shrinking, and the for-mation of ice crystals. It may be over-wrapped with

foil or plastic for storage of more than a few days. After the carton has been partially used, the surface of the ice cream should be covered with protective wrap, the kind that molds to the ice cream itself.
