LOCK HAVEN — Paul L. Courter, RD#2, Mill Hall led the Clinton County Dairy Herd Improvement Association for May, 1986

The top herd in the Clinton County DHIA for May is owned by Paul L. Courter, RD#2, Mill Hall, while the cow completing the highest lactation was owned by Richard L. Schenck, RD#2, Box 500, Mill Hall.

The top herd of Registered Holsteins completed the month with a Rolling Herd Average of 18,829 pounds of milk per cow, yielding 692 pounds of butterfat

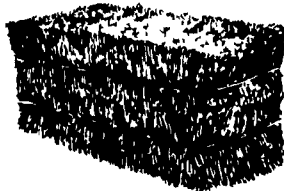

Ice cream and ice milk may be kept up to two months if stored at 0°F or below. A tightly closed carton prevents drying, shrinking, and the formation of ice crystals. It may be over-wrapped with

foil or plastic for storage of more than a few days. After the carton has been partially used, the surface of the ice cream should be covered with protective wrap, the kind that molds to the ice cream itself.
