

Wye Field Day Set for Aug. 21

COLLEGE PARK, Md. — When time are tough for farmers, the tough farmers have one essential question: "How can I squeeze a little more profit out of my operation?"

For some new answers to that old question, farmers and agricultural leaders can look this year to the Wye Field Day, sponsored by the University of Maryland.

"Farmers want to know how to increase their profitability, not necessarily their yields. And in planning this year's program, we've tried to fill that information need," says Brinsfield.

The following is a sampling of what's in store:

- Row crop farmers can find out how to get the most out of their investment in herbicides, which are the up and coming soybean varieties, and how they can help reduce pollution of surface and ground water supplies.

- Fruit, vegetable and nursery producers can learn the latest on the blossoming cut-flower industry in this area, how well new virus-free blackberries are performing, how to manage high-density plantings of peaches, and how to deal with pests on ornamental plants.

- Livestock and forage producers will learn how to measure and improve the reproductive capabilities of beef bulls and cows, and how to graze more animals on their fields.

- Farm families and anyone with financial responsibilities in an agricultural business will get

expert help on financial, insurance, and estate planning. And they will also get tips on how to deal with stress during financially troublesome times.

The 1986 Wye Field Day also will include exhibits, clinics, lunch, and — to top off the day — a crab feast.

The costs of the luncheon and crab feast are nominal — everything else is free.

The Wye Research and Education Center is located off US Route 50 east, approximately 3 miles east of the US 50-301 split and 3 miles west of MD Route 213. Look for signs for the Wye Institute, Carmichael, and the Wye Field Day.

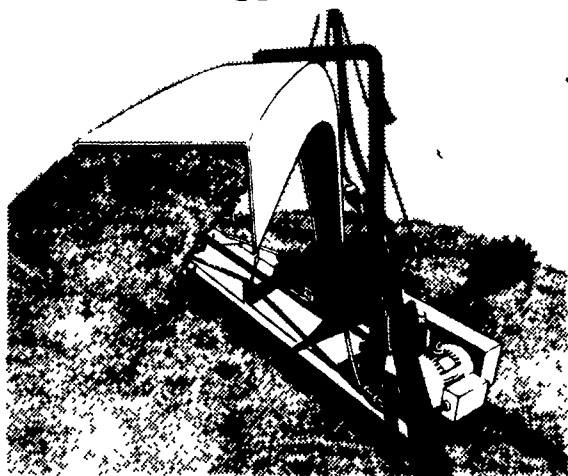

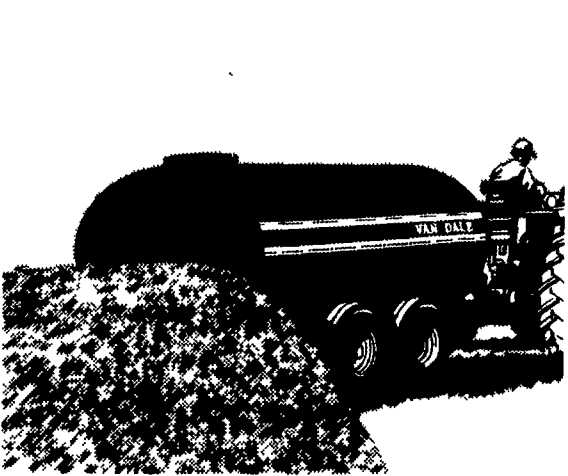

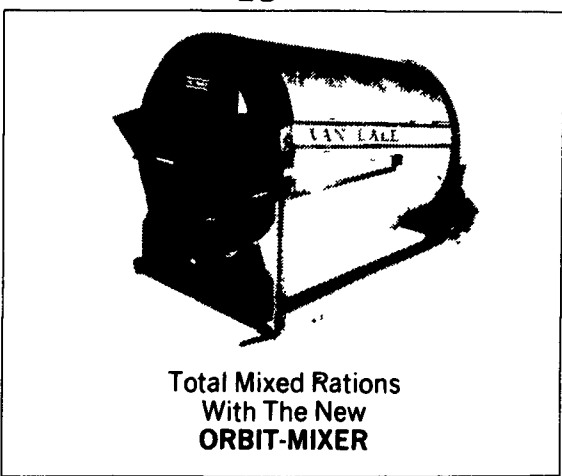
