

Allentown Fair Entries Being Accepted

ALLENTOWN Entries of exhibits and livestock for the 134th Allentown Fair are being accepted in Agricultural Hall now through Saturday, Aug. 9.

Registration hours are 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. everyday except Sundays. Friday, Aug. 8 the hours will be extended until 8 p.m., and Saturday, Aug. 9, closing day, they will be 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

The entry fee is \$6 and includes

admission to the grounds fair week.

Exhibits to be judged and displayed fair week range from farm and garden products to domestics and fine arts. Animals to be entered include cattle, swine, sheep, poultry, pigeons, rabbits and cavies.

A special category in celebration of the statue of Liberty and Ellis Island restoration has been added

this year. Prizes will be awarded for all types of memorabilia relating to the two national landmarks forming a special exhibit in Ag Hall. Any photos, souvenirs, memoirs, or other relics relating to the statue or island will be considered for entry.

Premium lists, containing entry procedures and rules and regulations, are available at the fair office behind the Ritz Bar-B-Q.

## Schuylkill County Fair Opens Aug. 13

SCHUYLKILL HAVEN — The Schuylkill County Fair will officially begin at 5 p.m. Wednesday Aug. 13 and continue through Sunday, Aug. 17. Opening ceremonies will be held at 7 p.m. Wednesday and will be followed by entertainment by the Cressona Band. The Fair is open daily 10 a.m. through 11 p.m. except Sunday, when the Fair will close at 6 p.m.

Admission is free, but there is a \$2 parking fee. Nightly en-

tertainment includes Cheyenne on Thursday, the Jordan Brothers Plus on Friday, Whiskey River, Saturday, and the Kerstetter Family and Bill Allison Gospel music, Sunday.

Premium books with entry information are available from Pennsylvania National Bank offices. Everyone is eligible to enter. Last year's fair boasted over 2,000 entries.

Transportation on the fairgrounds from the parking area to the exhibition area will be provided from 6 p.m. to 11:30 p.m. Thursday and Friday; from 5:30 p.m.to 11:30 p.m. Saturday; and from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday.

The Junior Livestock Sale, at which 4-H and FFA youth will sell market steers, hogs and lambs shown at the fair, will start at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, August 22.

Admission to the Westmoreland County Fair is \$2 for adults and 50 cents for children (6-12), and weekly passes are available for \$6 and \$2, respectively.

Entry information and schedules are available through the Westmoreland County Extension Service in Greensburg and many agricultural businesses throughout the county.
