

Market Comment: Prices were unchanged to lower on the large sizes; unchanged on mediums. was generally no better than tall Supplies of large were adequate or available and slow to clear, mainly in ungraded packs. Mediums were adequate and in good balance with overall needs. Extra large were irregularly distributed in a range of no more than adequate to fully adequate. Breaker interest was light as most continued to work off accumulated stock of lighter weight product. The undertone was unsettled.

Market Comment: Demand for ready to cook whole birds was mixed but generally improved. Offerings were somewhat easier to clear and at least adequate. Demand for parts had improved substantially on legs and particularly leg quarters and wings. Breast meat cleared with some irregularity but usually at lower trending prices. Less than trucklot asking prices were again lower and generally 63-71 cents. Live supplies were at least adequate. Weights were mixed but mostly desirable to light. Slaughter schedules were trimmed at most plants and very light in total. The undertone was improved but still barely steady to weak.


