favorites include: "Opportunity is usually disguised as hard work, so most people don't recognize it." -Ann Landers; "If you can't have the best of everything, make the best of everything you have;" "So live that every yesterday is a dream of happiness and every tomorrow a vision of hope.'

In addition to the fresh produce some local handwork is offered, mostly baskets. This year for the first time a neighbor is making baked goods for sale there.

Edith's work is centered around the market, but not exclusively. She has been working as chairman for the Palmyra Fresh Air program, and opened her own home to these children from New York City for 10 years. In addition, her own family has hosted exchange students from Finland, Sweden and Peru through the Lion's Club Youth Exchange. But whether foreign visitors or city visitors, they have had much the same reaction to living on Lehman's farm — "We didn't realize you worked so hard."

Saying they really are in the "people" business, Edith says those exchanges were a good experience for all involved. She's glad to show others that Americans are hard-working people.


