Plan To Reduce Harvest Loss

Fall is the best season to do some of the jobs to help you be proud of your lawn next spring. A thick accumulation of undecomposed organic material on the soil surface weakens the growth of the lawn grasses.

This condition, commonly referred to as thatch, if you dislike raking, you can rent a thatching machine to help remove thatch. Lawn clippings: To leave or not to leave, that is the question! If your grass clippings are one inch or less in length, then leave them where they fall, and not only will you have less work to do, but you will reduce your fertilizer needs by 25 percent. Contrary to the "old husband's tale," clippings left on the lawn will not add to thatch buildup, and will break down by the following day. If the lawn clippings are more than one-inch long, pick them up, for they can smother the grass and create an absolute mess turning a good lawn into a very poor one in a very short time, especially if it rains afterwards.
