Galen McDonald of Bedford County was on hand to observe the dairy competition, while the dairy goats were judged by Donna


Pennisk, a Westmoreland County goat and sheep breeder.

### Corn for Silage

Corn harvested for silage will yield about one-third more feed nutrients per acre than corn harvested for grain. Corn for silage should be managed as follows:


• Use a high grainyielding hybrid of the same maturity or just slightly later than one best suited for grain production on your

• Corn in the full-dent stage produces 50 percent more feed than in the milk stage and 100 percent more feed than in the silking stage. Corn harvested in the milk or silking stage produces silage of poorer quality.

• Corn planted at very high populations (40,000 or more) will not make high-quality silage. Use only for green feed.

· Male-sterile corn, grown for high stalksugar content, produces no grain and usually yields considerably less dry matter than adapted grain-producing corn hybrids.
