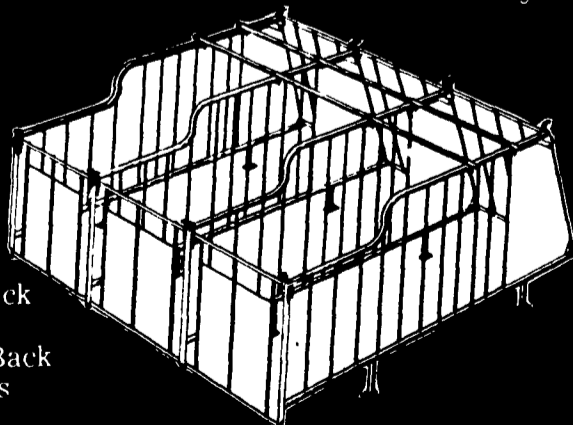

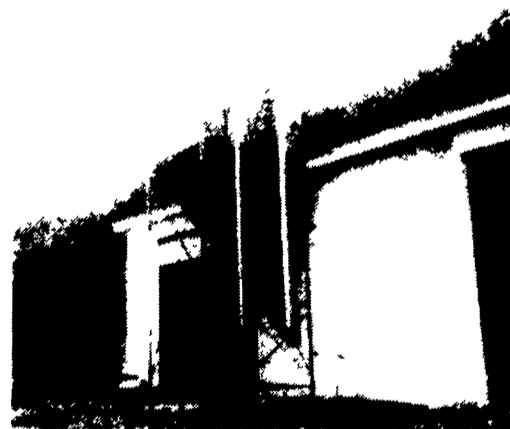
Joint Conservation Conference Scheduled
