

Northwest District 4-H Show Crowns Champions

PITTSFIELD — The 39th edition of the Northwest District 4-H Dairy Show was held recently at the Warren County Fairgrounds. Blue ribbon animals from this show will compete with the other 4-H districts' blue ribbon winners at the Junior All-American show on Monday.

Judge William Watchel tabbed John Kennedy's 3-year-old cow the best of the Brown Swiss show. This Butler County youth's champion was bred by H. Francis Kennedy. Tonya Black, Saegertown, claimed the reserve position with her senior 2-year-old sired by Lar-Le Stretch Titan.

Judge Donald Seipt chose Annie Rynd's 4-year-old cow as grand champion of the Holstein show. The Mercer County 4-Her's project was sired by Round-Oak R A Cheeko and bred by Rynd-Home Farm, Cochranon.

Justin Doeberienner of Jamestown stepped into the reserve position with Conrid Astrostar Lynn, a dry 5 year old.

The Whiting family of Edinburg claimed the grand and reserve spots of the Milking Shorthorn competition. Maggie took the grand champion rosette with her 6 year old while Bridget took the reserve ribbon with her intermediate calf.

Sabrina Wagner of Meadville garnered the Guernsey grand championship with her 8-year-old daughter of Lockshoe H Golden Eagle. Reserve honors went to Robin Wagner's 5 year old Housley's Dari Fayvor daughter.

The Jersey grand champion ribbon went to Marcy Resinger's 3-year-old project. Tenn Soldiers Pride sired the champion which was bred by Jesse Moore. Robert Reinsel of Mayport claimed the reserve position with a 4-year-old daughter of Tenn Soldiers Pride.

In the Ayrshire show, Lona Rader of Connoquenessing earned the grand championship with a junior 2-year-old daughter of Burr-Ayr Farms H K Barry. Kristie Kobosky of Mercer stepped into the reserve slot with her second-place junior 2-year-old.

30 YEARS AGO THIS WEEK

— The prevailing cycle of cool wet weather continued in Pennsylvania through the week ended Monday and gave farmers generally poor working conditions, the State Department of Agriculture said today.

Frequent showers and cloudy weather made hay drying difficult as wet ground retarded field work.

Low temperatures during the early part and near the end of the week retarded ripening of corn. In northern districts scattered frosts hurt some corn but damage was not extensive the Department reported. Some corn is being shocked in the Southeast.

— Neighbors and friends moved in within almost a matter of hours to help clean up wreckage of a tobacco barn blown 15 feet from its foundation by Monday night's terrific storm that raked the northwest part of the Garden Spot.

— Damage will run into thousands of dollars in a Monday evening windstorm that raked the northwestern section of Lancaster County, leaving in its wake toppled trees, broken power and telephone lines, damaged buildings.

Crops were slashed by tornadic winds, rain and hail that moved through neighborhoods north of Lancaster, into East Petersburg,

Neffsville, Landisville, Mount Joy and Florin. Winds of 68 mi. per hour were recorded at the Lancaster Airport and were undoubtedly heavier in the storm.

— Reporting a yield of twenty 5/8ths bushel baskets from one peach tree, Freeman Aukamp, R1 New Providence, is shown in this issue with some prime pickings in his orchards. On his 4½ acres of peaches, despite recent windstorms that caused heavy windfall, many trees are still yielding 10-12 baskets each. Picking, extending over 4½ weeks, has produced one of the heaviest crops and one of the longest picking seasons in Mr. Aukamp's ten year history in peaches.

— Workers add more baskets of tomatoes to the lines on the farm of Paul Herr near Unicorn, bringing the average this year to way above 15 tons per acre. Mr. Herr says his field still has green tomatoes, unless frost comes earlier.

Order 4 Milk Set At \$14.36

ALEXANDRIA, Va. — Middle Atlantic Order Market Administrator Joseph D. Shine announced a Class I milk price of \$14.36 per hundredweight for October 1986. This price is up 27 cents from September and is 50 cents above last October's Class I price.

Shine announced a Class II milk price of \$11.45 per hundredweight for August 1986 and a butterfat differential of 17.7 cents for the month. The Class II price was up 34 cents from the previous month,

while the butterfat differential increased 1.2 cents.

The October 1986 Class I price and the August 1986 Class II price are based on the August 1986 Minnesota-Wisconsin manufacturing milk price of \$11.33 per hundredweight at a 3.5 percent butterfat content.

The USDA reported that the wholesale price of Grade A butter at Chicago for August was \$1.5386 per pound and the nonfat dry milk price was \$.8034 per pound, f.o.b. plants in the Chicago area.
