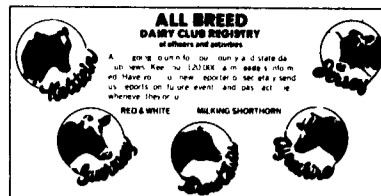

A tour of the Hills-Hope herd and inspection of their milking ET daughters will follow the embryo work.

During the afternoon session, Dr. Allen McCauley of Elizabethtown, Pa. will discuss the future farm application of ET and a new one-step freeze and thaw technique for embryos.
