

Penn State Schedules Ag Festival

BELLEFONTE — The Penn State Agricultural Student Council has planned the annual Ag Hill Festival to celebrate "More Than a Century of Excellence" in the College of Agriculture at Penn State. In the past, the College has boasted such achievements as semen freezing at the Dairy Breeding Research Center and the Armsby Calorimeter. In recent years, Penn State Agriculture has completed research on Crown-vetch and the Geranium. These and other achievements will be highlighted during the two-day event scheduled for October 24 and 25.

In addition to the celebration, several annual events will occur also. On Friday evening, Oct. 24, there will be a social at the Delta Theta Sigma Fraternity. Saturday morning opens with team competition in the annual Ag Olympics. Teams can register beginning at 9:30 a.m. in the parking lot by the Meats Lab on the Penn State campus. Teams from College wide clubs will compete with faculty and commonwealth campus teams

in events such as the milk-suckle, the bale-toss, and the egg-toss.

Saturday evening begins with a banquet at 7 p.m., at the Penn State Agricultural Arena.

During the banquet, the winners of the day's events will be announced as well as the selection of Mr. and Ms. College of Ag. Mr. and Ms. College of Ag will represent the college throughout the year at such events as the Farm Show and Ag Progress Days.

In addition, they will visit high schools throughout the state promoting the College of Agriculture at Penn State.

During the evening, eight contestants will present speeches centering around their experiences in the College of Agriculture. After the banquet, a social will be held at the Alpha Gamma Rho Fraternity.

Drought Produces Tasty Apples

ANNAPOLIS, Md. — The drought of 1986 has brought some good news for apple lovers: the taste of Maryland-grown apples this season is excellent, according to the Maryland State Apple Commission.

What the drought has done to the state's apple crop is to concentrate sugars in the apples which makes for a better flavor. On the negative side, the proportion of smaller-sized fruit is higher than normal.

Maryland apples, from this year's 80 million pound crop, are

now in abundant supply in stores and at roadside stands.

What saved the crop this year from the ravages of the drought was a combination of mild weather with cool nights during mid and late August when the majority of apples were finishing on the trees. Also helping is the fact that most of the producing trees in Maryland's western fruit belt are established, deep-rooted trees. Thus, they were able to obtain the water they needed via deep set roots.

The 21-member board of dairy farmers sets the policy and oversees a \$2 million annual advertising promotion and research budget. All of the members contribute to the state program.

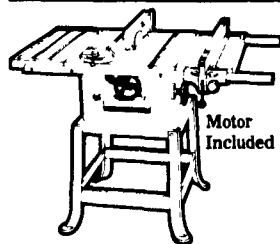

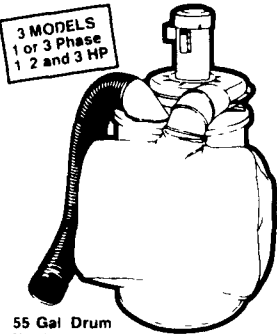
