

Gramm-Rudman Revoked For 1987

WASHINGTON — Congress met budgetary goals at the end of last week and revoked Gramm-Rudman assessments for farmers in 1987, an ASCS official explained. However, crop benefit payments on the 1986 harvest will continue to be cut by the 4.3 percent during 1987, according to Dave Hall, director of the budget division for ASCS. This rate was established by Gramm-Rudman for fiscal year 1986 to meet the budget deficit goal, Hall noted.

He added that the 12 cents per hundredweight of milk which dairy farmers were assessed will be dropped; no additional assessment will be levied. Late last week Congress and the administration worked out a budget that met the target deficit of \$144 billion, Hall said. This target triggered the rescinding of the Gramm-Rudman assessments for farmers, he added.

USDA Buyout Report

WASHINGTON — An estimated 11,700 head of dairy cattle were slaughtered in federally inspected plants during the week ending Oct. 4, as a result of the Dairy Termination Program, the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced Wednesday.

This total includes all cows, heifers and calves identified as dairy animals designated for disposition in compliance with the program requirements.

The cumulative total of cattle slaughtered under the program from April 1 through Oct. 4 is an

estimated 801,400 head.

The purchases of meat in addition to normal purchases are to help offset the effects of the DTP on the domestic meat market. For the two-week period ending Oct. 11, the government purchased 241,250 pounds of meat. The cumulative purchases, reported bi-weekly as of Oct. 11, total 297.5 million pounds.

Dairy cattle reported for export under the program for the period April 1 to Oct. 18 totaled an estimated 38,035 head. An estimated 1,032 were exported during the week ending Oct. 18.

conducted as part of the Cooperative Research Farms program. The Agway research will include a complete lactation period under farm conditions to determine the practical aspects of providing cows with BST.

BST falls under the jurisdiction of the Food & Drug Administration and must be proved safe and effective under strict registration processes.

NEW FEED PATENTS GRANTED

Agway was granted two new patents in early October on methods used to measure and regulate nonstructural car-

bohydrates in dairy feeds. One patent covers a method for regulating types of carbohydrates, and the other a method for measuring types of carbohydrates. The procedure involves the use of natural feed ingredients measured for nonstructural carbohydrate content.

The patented process is the result of several years of study by Agway's dairy research team as part of the Cooperative Research Farms program. Milk production was increased by 10% and feed efficiency was improved by 13% in the research studies.
