General Manager Michael Donovan said the new headquarters facility "is slightly bigger and is a better building than the former complex at 6567 Kinne Road, which the co-op had occupied since 1969.

Donovan said the co-op had been planning to renovate the old facility when the new one, formerly occupied by a division of Bristol Laboratories, "came on the market at the right place."
