## Delmarva Poultry

Thursday, Nov. 12, 1986

Market Comment: Movement of ready to cook whole birds was seasonally slow to fair. Offerings were irregularly available. Demand for dark meat and wings was light for the adequate to ample offerings and the bulk of trading was at lower trending prices. White meat cleared well, particularly rib-on-breasts which were short of full call. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 55-62 cents with some spot trading reported with reduced or no premium attached. Live supplies were generally moderate at mixed weights. Slaughter schedules continued to be adjusted to accommodate the lighter call and were light in total. The undertone was just steady at best.

Market Comment: Too few prices to report; however, some limited activity noted at 17-19 cents farm. Off-farm movement was light to just fair but expected to increase as the holiday draws nearer. Some plants pulling in more heavies than normal to offset the scarcity of light type. Finished demand was moderate to good but tempered overall due to the current canner prices.

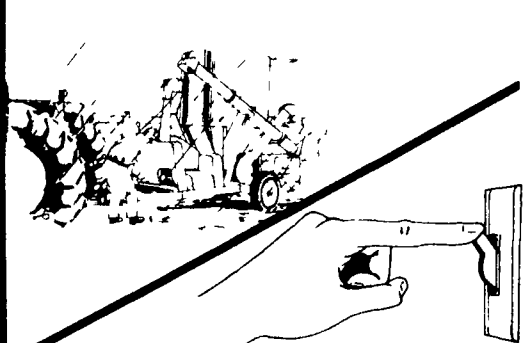
