Compared with last week's close slaughter steers and heifers closed this week 1.00 to 2.00 higher. Slaughter cows closed generally steady to weak. Bulls steady. Bulk of supply Monday with not enough sales Wednesday for a market test. Supply mainly good to average choice slaughter steers and heifers with 18% cows. Estimated receipts this week about 1850 as compared with actual receipts of 2308 a week ago and 1882 a year ago.
