
POULTRY MARKETS

Market Comment: Prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady. Cartoned egg demand was mostly moderate. Supplies are usually sufficient for the current need.

Delmarva Poultry Wednesday, Nov. 26, 1986

Market Comment: Demand for ready to cook whole birds was slightly improved in most quarters but still no better than fair overall. Offerings remained available and fully sufficient to handle current interest. Parts movement was also improved and all items were moving into better balance, particularly leg quarters. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 53-60 cents and product was still negotiable in some quarters. Live supplies were light

to moderate. Weights were in a full range. Slaughter schedules were light. All plants are down for the holiday and a few will be closed on Friday. The undertone was barely steady.
