Penn State Honors Plant Research Aid

UNIVERSITY PARK - Clendon E. Hollar, research aide for the plant nutrition laboratory in the Department of Horticulture at Penn State, was honored for his 25 years of service with the College of Agriculture at an awards ceremony yesterday.

Hollar specializes in plant leaf analysis for research and extension. Using a spectrometer, he scans plant material for 12 elements, such as phosphorus, potash and nitrogen and prepares reports for researchers in the College and Agriculture as well as for the U.S. Department of Garden center operators can Agriculture Research Station at Beltsville, the Rodale Institute other universities, and state departments of agriculture.

After graduating from Butler High School in Ohio, he entered the Air Force and was assigned coding and statistical work. In 1951 he moved to Bellefonte to work as a laboratory technician with Cerro Copper and Brass Company, then known as Titan Metal Company.
