Lueck's wife, Pat, called the 25 years, 9 months and 6 days in Lancaster County's extension

service "excellent, great years." She added, "This is the ending of one chapter and the beginning of another."

Reflecting on his own career in the county, Lueck said the job was "challenging, uplifting and rewarding." He said he always tried to use the positive approach, adding, "I certainly have enjoyed what I've done."

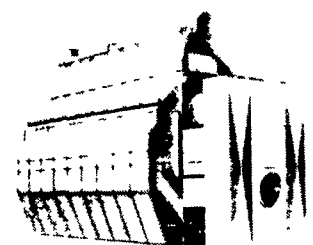
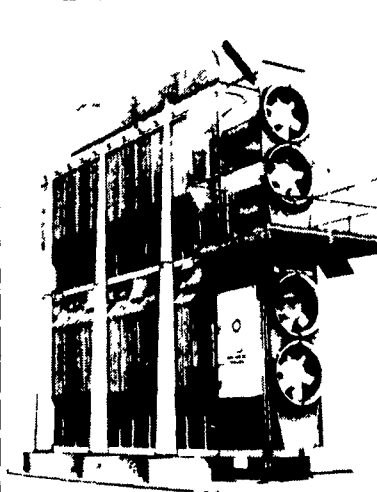
