and place these over perennial flowers. The dense needles serve as a temporary mulch. Fir branches and pines will retain most of their needles until spring at which time the boughs can be removed

If you live in a community where a shredder machine is available, the tree is ground up into a very satisfactory wood mulch to be used as needed. Christmas trees take years to grow. Get the most out of yours. Re-evaluate its potential after the holidays, urges Arnold G. Lueck, Lancaster County extension horticultural agent.
