For a green color, dissolve one pound of boric acid in one gallon of water For a red color, substitute strontium nitrate, for blue, copper sulphate Soak the pinecones for eight hours or so in the solution, then dry them thoroughly in the sun Epsom salts used in the same proportions will also give you colors


