Weekly 51- Cattle- Compared to last week, Slaughter steers and heifers closed mostly 50 cents lower after recovering most of early week moderate declines. Stronger country market attitudes and good packer interest coupled with good movement of beef in both carcasses and boxes, prompted turn arounds in buyer bids at midweek. Slaughter cows 2.00-3.00 higher, instances 4.00 higher. Slaughter Bulls 2.00 higher.

Estimated 5 day receipts this week 6,700 compared to 4 day actual last holiday shortened week of 4,383 and 5 day actuals last year of 8,148. Slaughter steers accounted for 49 percent of receipts, slaughter heifers 39 percent. Slaughter cows 9 percent and feeder cattle 1 percent.
