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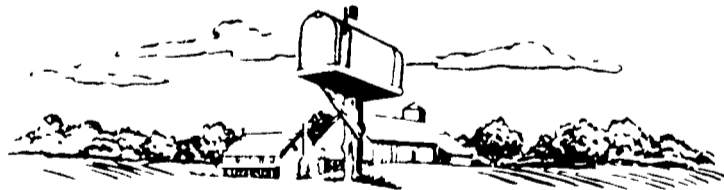
GRAIN AND LIVESTOCK FUTURES MARKET TRENDS

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(Based on closing bids of Thurs., Jan. 8)
ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures closed lower today in active trading, after trading higher in mid-session. Commission house selling erased early gains and country movement continues to be heavy. Sellers were spurred on by ideas of overbought conditions looking for Friday's close to be lower. The Gulf basis was up 1/2 cent.
ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybean futures closed higher in nearby and lower in the deferred months. This is a repeat of yesterday's performance. Buyers were encouraged due to export rumors that the USSR had recently booked freight for shipment of soybeans from the US Gulf. Deliveries were 295,000 bushels

against January futures through December 9th. deliveries were extremely light compared to earlier in the week, with commercials receiving most of the notices. Brazil's bean crop is estimated at 16 million metric tonnes which is up from the 14 million metric tonnes produced in the 1986 crop. This is due to extremely good growing conditions. Slightly lower overnight.
ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures closed higher across the board in good follow through buying from yesterday's strong 8 cent rally. The side ways trend is still intact. When good returns to the grain pit, wheat still has a chance of trading over \$3.00.

SOFT RED WINTER WHEAT GULF BASIS- unchanged.

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Live cattle futures higher to sharply higher on follow-through buying. Feeder cattle futures have regained much of last week's losses, probing above \$63.00. Cattle were also supported by higher cash prices and good box beef movement. Snow is expected in the northern Panhandle region and Kansas encouraging packers to buy.
ACRES HOG UPDATE: Live hog futures closed higher to sharply higher in an active trading session. Pork bellies recovered some of yesterday's losses - the cash market was a "mixed bag" as terminals were higher in some areas and lower in others depending on location. Pork Products: Loins steady to \$1.00 higher; Hams steady; Bellies \$1.25-\$2.00 lower at noon.



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
