Farm-City awards were presented during Secretary of Agriculture's Night at the 1987 Pennsylvania Farm Show. Second and third place went to the Franklin County Farm-City Council and the Lebanon Valley Chamber of Commerce/Lebanon Farm-City Council, respectively.

Sponsored by Kiwanis In-

ternational and administered in Pennsylvania by the Farm-City Council, Farm-City events are intended to foster a greater awareness of the interdependence of urban and rural residents.

The councils maintain scrapbooks of their activities and submit them to be judged.

Berks County's council began activities March 20 (Agriculture Day) in Pennsylvania) with an Ag Baby Day. Parents of the first baby born that day were presented with a basket of gifts. Also sponsored were a poultry farm tour for the Berks County Chamber of Commerce, a county dairy festival and a Farm-City day observance that featured an agricultural display at the Penn Square Mall in downtown Reading.

Other activities included a farmschool exchange, farm-business person exchange, farm-city conservation tour, banquet and tour of county farms.

Franklin County's efforts included a farm-city exposition at the Chambersburg Mall, railroad trip and luncheon for nursing home residents, decoration and display of pumpkins during the annual Pumpkin Caper, open houses at Gibble's Potato Chip plant and Lehman's Egg Service, elementary art poster contest and a job exchange program.

The Franklin County Farm-City Council also was host for the 1986 state Farm-City Week kick-off banquet. Lebanon's council sponsored a media breakfast in a farm setting to announce farm-city week, a show at the Lebanon Valley Mall, senior citizens tour of local businesses and farms and a job exchange in which local farmers and business community leaders exchanged jobs.
