FEEDER CATTLE IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS AND THE MIDWEST RANGED STEADY TO \$4.00 HIGHER AS SLAUGHTER CATTLE MOVED STEADY TO \$2.00 HIGHER STEER AND HEIFER BEEF HELD STEADY TO \$2.00 HIGHER COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS FOLLOWED THE UNEVEN PRICES IN THE MIDWEST WHILE COW BEEF RANGED STEADY TO \$2.00 HIGHER THE BOXED BEEF CUT-OUT VALUE OF CHOICE 2-3, 550-700 LBS CARCASSES REACHED \$98.75/CWT TUESDAY THIS WAS \$1.83 HIGHER THAN LAST WEEK BEEF PRODUCTION LAST WEEK TOTALED 443.8 MILLION LBS 5 PERCENT BELOW THE PREVIOUS WEEK AND 1 PERCENT ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE WEIGHTS WERE 5 LBS LIGHTER VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS FOLLOWED EAST COAST CARCASS PRICES STEADY TO \$3.00 HIGHER BEFORE CLOSING \$2.00-7.00 LOWER SLAUGHTER LAST WEEK WAS UNCHANGED FROM THE PREVIOUS WEEK BUT 4 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO WHEN AVERAGE WEIGHTS WERE 5 LB HEAVIER LAMB PRICES IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS AND THE MIDWEST WERE STEADY TO \$2.00 LOWER UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF LOWER EAST

COAST CARCASS PRICES THAT WERE STEADY TO \$6.00 LOWER THAN LAST WEEK SLAUGHTER WAS 8 PERCENT BELOW THE PREVIOUS WEEK AND ALSO 8 PERCENT BELOW LAST YEAR WHEN AVERAGE WEIGHTS WERE UNCHANGED HOG PRICES IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS AND THE MIDWEST WERE STEADY TO \$1.50 HIGHER AS PORK PRODUCT PRICES WERE UNEVENLY STEADY TO \$2.50 HIGHER BEFORE CLOSING LOWER PORK PRODUCTIONS LAST WEEK WAS 2 PERCENT BELOW THE PREVIOUS WEEK BUT 4 PERCENT ABOVE A YEAR AGO AVERAGE WEIGHTS WERE 7 LBS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR THE RICHMOND HOG MARKET CLOSED STEADY TO \$1.00 HIGHER THAN LAST WEDNESDAY WITH BARROWS AND GILTS 1-4, 220-250 LBS AT \$47.50-49.00/CWT TOTAL RECEIPTS FOR THE WEEK 306 HEAD THE SOUTHEAST VIRGINIA HOG MARKET CLOSED 50 CENT HIGHER THAN LAST WEDNESDAY WITH BARROWS AND GILTS 1-4, 220-250 LBS AT \$49.00-50.00/CWT
