ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybean futures closed sharply lower at or near session lows...setting new contract lows again today. At midday, beans were mostly higher, with buying centered on the deferreds. Expectations that light delivery notices will be posted against March on Friday underpinned any gains in the nearby.

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures closed mostly higher, with March posting a loss of 1/4 cent. This market was influenced mainly by bear spreading of May/Mar and scattered commercial selling on the news of a completed sale to wheat to Egypt. Deferred wheat maintained its ad

vances throughout today's session on commission house and professional buying linked to ideas that yesterday's losses were overdone and the market was due for a technical correction.

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Live cattle futures closed sharply lower in a deteriorating session again today. Aggressive selling stimulated when the noon dressed beef prices quoted were quoted \$1.00 to \$2.00 lower. Concerns about retail demand fueled selling pressuring both live cattle and feeder cattle futures. Bull spreaders liquidated positions today also adding weakness to the overall tone. The seasonal uptrend

that lasts until Mid February is apparently over with for now.

ACRES HOG UPDATE: Live hog futures closed sharply lower and pork belly futures closed in a very weak mode today. The cash market started out steady to \$.50 lower with some quotes of \$1.00 lower in early trading. The overall cash market has settled between \$ 46.00 and \$48.00 in today's trade. The first notice day for March pork bellies will be this coming Friday, so traders were rolling forward the long positions in March and placing them in May. Concerns over large daily slaughter continues to plague the market.

Estimated slaughter today was 295,000 compared with 300,000 yesterday.
