processing figures, processed tobacco that sells for \$2 a pound would net the farmer 90 cents, with 20 cents of this received in ad-

vance.

Another proposal to process the tobacco has been offered by the J.I. Miller Company of Wilson, N.C. According to Aaron Stauffer of General Tobacco Suppliers of

Pa., located in Ephrata, the Miller firm has offered to take the tobacco on a consignment basis, offering no money in advance.

Miller will pick up and process the tobacco and assume all expenses for one year. After 12 months, if the tobacco is not sold, the grower must pay the expenses,

or roughly 21 cents a pound on a green weight basis. Stauffer said the firm will accept processed tobacco as payment, offering 75 cents a pound, stripped weight. After the grower pays expenses Miller will store the tobacco indefinitely for one cent a pound, green weight, per year.

"It's not a salvation, but it is an alternative," Probst said of the recently hatched plans to process tobacco. Of the approximately 10 million pounds of 609 grown in Pennsylvania, Probst estimates that only about one-fourth of the crop has been sold this year. If buyers should fill orders before all the tobacco is sold, the processing route is the logical way for growers to at least minimize their losses.

Probst emphasized that the auctions plan to continue to sell

tobacco as long as there is a market.

Ken Brubaker agrees that buyers should take advantage of the auction floor as long as the market holds up. The president of the Keystone Tobacco Marketing Group, Brubaker advises farmers to continue selling through auctions as long as the tobacco is bringing 50 cents a pound or higher. "Fifty cents today is better in your pocket than not knowing what the final price will be through a pool," he said. "The auction system is still working. Prices this past week were stronger than ever for the bulk of the tobacco," he summed up.

Probst calculated that farmers would have to receive \$1.30 per pound of processed tobacco to equal 50 cents on the auction block.
