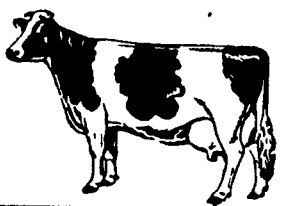


Major Dairy Sales And Dispersals Nationwide

milk with a 5.5 test. Her twin sister classified Very Good with 1,000 pounds of fat. A maternal sister scored EX-91 as a 2 year old with an actual production of 15,000 milk. The next two dams classified EX-92.

A 6-month-old Shultz Performing Legend daughter sold for the second best price of \$1,500.

Her dam, an Excellent Master Milestone C daughter, produced a top record of 14,560 milk with a 5.4 test. She has two Excellent maternal sisters.

The next dam classified Excellent and produced a top record of 18,560 milk with a 5.4 test as a 10 year old. Her lifetime record-to-date stands at 110,000 milk with an average test of 5.4 percent.

Larry Benson auctioneered the sale. The Massachusetts Jersey Cattle Club managed the sale. Sale chairman John Miller noted the average was slightly higher than last year. He added that a standing-room-only crowd witnessed the sale. Animals were sold to Canada, Idaho, Illinois, and throughout the Northeast.

HOLSTEIN
The MINNESOTA CONVENTION CLASSIC averaged \$1,623 on 38 whole lots.

A VG-86 3-year-old, sired by Willow Farm Rockman Ivanhoe, topped the sale with a bid of \$3,350.

Just-fresh and producing 94 pounds of milk a day, she completed a top record of 22,338 milk and 861 fat in 346 days.

Her dam, a VG-88 Elevation

daughter, produced a high record of 28,920 milk and 1,147 fat in 365 days.

The next dam classified VG-87 with a top record of 25,490 milk and 910 fat.

Sired by Browndale Concord-ET, the second high lot sold for \$3,000. A GP-84 3 year old, she produced a first-calf record of 22,500 milk. Her record-in-progress stands at 3,777 milk and 101 fat in 42 days. She sold bred to Enhancer.

Her dam, a VG-85 Elevation Ivan daughter, produced a top record of 26,130 milk and 897 fat in 365 days. The next dam classified VG-85.

John Hager auctioneered the sale and the Snyder-Hager Sales managed the sale. Mike Snyder noted the average increased over \$200 from last year's sale.

The BADGER INVITATIONAL SALE held in Wisconsin averaged \$2,130 on 54 Holsteins and \$900 on eight Jerseys.

A 2-year-old cow by Valiant topped the sale by selling for \$9,400. Classified VG-85, she will freshen in June to Coldsprings Levi. Her first record, in progress, stands at 14,544 milk and 603 fat in 241 days. She owns a Cow Index of

plus 1,087 milk, plus .09 test, plus 56 fat and plus \$152.

Her dam, an 86-point Walley daughter, produced a top record of 31,883 milk with a 4.3 percent test and 1,366 fat in 365 days. She owns a Cow Index of plus \$159.

Selling for \$4,000 and the second best price was an 82-point 3 year old. Fresh in January, the Lime Hollow Elevation Mars daughter completed a first lactation of 17,940 milk and 608 fat in 276 days. She has an EX-90 maternal sister with 22,500 milk and 878 fat.

Her dam is an Excellent Monitor daughter with a best record of 28,950 milk and 1,235 fat for a 4.3 test in 365 days. The next dam is an Excellent Bootmaker daughter with a top record of 25,780 milk and 976 fat in 365 days.

A first-calf 3 year old topped the

Jersey portion of the sale with a bid of \$1,675. Sired by Samson she freshened in January and classified VG-87.

Her dam, an 87-point JFD Empire daughter, produced a top record of 11,842 milk and 720 fat for a 6.1 test.

Over 600 people attended the sale. Dave Dixon, a professor at the University of Wisconsin, noted the crowd had a feeling of optimism about the dairy industry.

The sale crew consisted of volunteer alumni from the University of Wisconsin. Dan Schnell, a senior dairy science major, managed the sale. Tom Morris served as auctioneer. Jim Hoskens and Marlowe Nelson read pedigrees. The University of Wisconsin Dairy Science Club sponsored the sale.

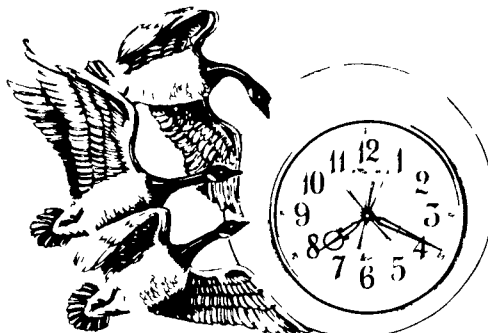

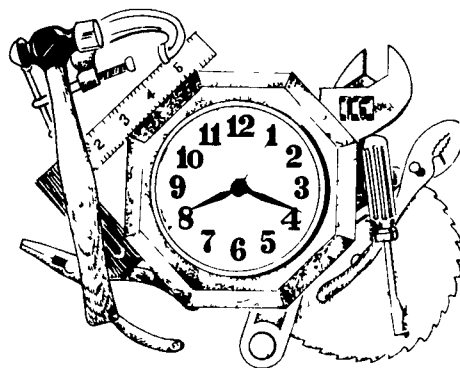
