Market Comment: Demand for ready to cook whole birds was no better than fair and offerings continued easily available at discount to normal. Demand in the parts complex was mixed but generally improved compared to recent few days. Supplies remained at least adequate on all items. Less than trucklot asking prices were one to two cents lower at 43-49 cents and trading was still occurring at lower levels. Live supplies were generally moderate with some emphasis of increased mortality and weight loss being noted. Weights were mixed by mostly desirable to a bit heavy. Slaughter schedules moderately heavy. The undertone was weak.
