Compared with last week's close slaughter steers closed 2.00 to 2.50 higher; heifers 1.00 to 2.00 higher. Slaughter cows firm to 3.00 higher. Bulls closed 1.50 to 3.00 higher. Few individuals and small packages Wednesday sold higher, but volume insufficient for adequate market test. Supply mainly good to low choice slaughter steers and heifers with 6% cows. Estimated receipts this week about 1300 as compared with actual receipts of 964 a week ago and 1037 a year ago.


