ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures closed lower today pressured by slightly over bought conditions. The down turn in today's market was attributed to a lack of fresh fundamental news. Commercial buying was linked to Taiwan's tender for U.S. corn. Generic certificate traded today at 103.5% to 104.5.

ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybean futures closed lower in quiet trading. Nearby options remain under pressure due to lower Gulf bids. Farmer selling is

expected to step up overnight. Slight pressure was added on ideas of South American bean sales near term.

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures closed lower in a light luster trading session. Traders are still hoping for a U.S. export bonus wheat offer to U.S.S.R. Commercial and professional bear spreading was noted throughout the session.

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Cattle futures closed sharply lower in nearby options. Long liquidation was the main factor in

today's losses due to the approaching of the first notice day. Feeders closed mixed with March supported by the firm cash market.

CME FEEDER CATTLE SETTLEMENT: \$68.92 as of 3/24/87 + \$.27. Estimated slaughter today was 126,000 to 129,000 compared to 122,000 Wednesday.

ACRES HOG UPDATE: Hog futures closed sharply lower today. Traders are expecting increased daily slaughter due to hogs coming to the market after this week's winter storm. Also weakness was attributed to position evening ahead of next weeks hogs and pig report.

Estimated slaughter today was 287,000 compared with 279,000 on Wed.

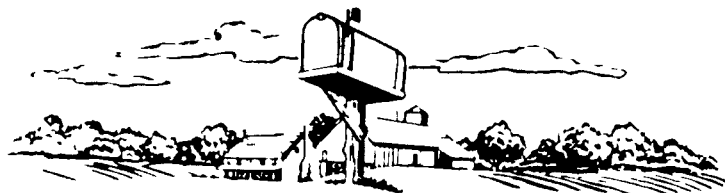
