WEEKLY REVIEW IN VIRGINIA MARKETS IN REVIEW, MARCH 26-APRIL 1, 1987. FEEDER CATTLE IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS AND SLAUGHTER CATTLE IN NATIONAL AND VIRGINIA MARKETS WERE STEADY TO \$2.00 HIGHER DURING THE WEEK. SOME WEAKNESS WAS NOTED IN THE DIRECT TRADING AREA OF THE MIDWEST. CARCASS BEEF PRICES WERE 50 CENT TO \$2.00 LOWER. THE BOXED-BEEF CUT-OUT VALUE OF CHOICE 2-3 550-700 LB CARCASSES WERE \$102.42 TUESDAY THIS WAS 62 CENT LOWER THAN LAST WEEK. A WAIT AND SEE ATTITUDE WAS IN THE FACE OF LOWER PRICE UNDERTONES WAS NOTED DURING THE MIDDLE OF THE WEEK. COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$4.00 HIGHER WHILE THE MIDWEST WAS STEADY TO \$3.00 LOWER. COW BEEF PRICES HAD CUTTERS STEADY TO 50 CENT LOWER PERCENT PRODUCTION LAST WEEK WAS DOWN 1.1 PERCENT FROM THE PREVIOUS WEEK AND DOWN 3.3 PERCENT FROM A YEAR AGO AVERAGE WEIGHTS 10 LBS LIGHTER THAN LAST YEAR VEAL AND CALF PRICES AT VIRGINIA AUCTIONS WERE \$2.00 HIGHER WHILE EAST COAST CARCASS PRICES WERE UNEVENLY STEADY TO \$2.00 HIGHER LAST

WEEK SLAUGHTER WAS DOWN 2.4 PERCENT FROM A WEEK AGO AND DOWN 4.2 PERCENT FROM A YEAR AGO WHEN AVERAGE WEIGHTS 9 LBS. LIGHTER. LAMB PRICES IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS WERE \$2.50-3.00 HIGHER, MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$2.00 HIGHER ROCKINGHAM AUCTION IN VIRGINIA RECEIVED \$93.50 FOR SPRING LAMBS. SAN ANGELO, TEXAS SOME FEEDER LAMBS WERE AS HIGH AS \$114.00 PER CWT. SLAUGHTER WAS 7 PERCENT BELOW THE PREVIOUS WEEK AND 14 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO. HOG PRICES IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS AND MIDWEST STEADY TO 25 CENT LOWER WEAKENING TOWARD THE END OF THE WEEK. PORK PRODUCTS ENDED THE WEEK STEADY TO ABOUT \$1.00 HIGHER PORK PRODUCTION WAS DOWN 5.8 PERCENT FROM A WEEK AGO AND DOWN 4.6 PERCENT FROM A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE WEIGHTS WERE 1 LB LIGHTER THE RICHMOND HOG MARKET CLOSED STEADY TO 90 CENT LOWER THAN LAST WEDNESDAY WITH BARROWS AND GILTS 1-4, 220-250 LBS AT \$46.00-46.50 PER CWT TOTAL RECEIPTS FOR THE WEEK 189 HEAD THE SOUTHEAST VIRGINIA HOG MARKET CLOSED \$1.00 LOWER THAN LAST WEDNESDAY WITH BARROWS AND GILTS 1-4, 220-250 LBS AT \$47.00-47.50 PER CWT. 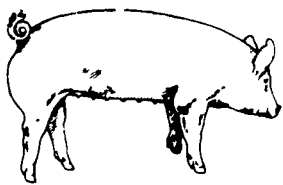

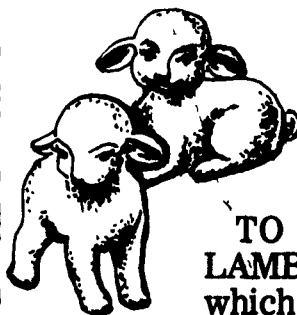
