Ask the Old Farmer: I have a steam iron with a lot of rust inside. How can I remove the rust?

Take 1/2 cup of white vinegar and 1 tablespoon of baking soda and stir until well mixed. Pour it in the iron. Run the iron then rinse twice with warm water or pour in the mix to fill the cavity and leave overnight then rinse with warm water.
Home Hints: Rather than discarding melon and squash seeds, put them on the feeder for the birds.
