> FUTURES MARKET TRENDS GRAIN AND LIVESTOCK

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ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures closed higher from 1/2 cent to 1-1/2 cents after a choppy trading session. Gains were prompted by late local shortcovering before the holiday weekend. Rumors of the possibility of an export bonus offer to the USSR also helped to alleviate pressure from early sales caused by a weakening foreign currency and precious metal market. Declining Texas Gulf CCC PIK prices yesterday influenced early selling.

Generic certificates traded steady at 104% to 105-3/4%

ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybean futures settled mixed today from up one cent to down one-half cent after trading lower most of the day. Gains on the close attributed to delayed Brazillian harvest and late commission house buying connected to the pre-weekend short covering. Locals and commission houses are still holding long positions with ideas that increasing inflation will not disappear.

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures closed higher across the board again today with new crop settling up sharply higher. Most gains are directly attributable to the presistant talk of a soon to be announced export bonus wheat offer to the Soviet Union.

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Live cattle futures settled basically unchanged while feeder cattle settled mixed. Cash connected long liquidation was the main feature for April, even though cash fundamentals remain strong and supplies are tight. Some floor traders and analysts feel beef cut-out values and dressed beef carcass prices are nearing retail resistance.

ACRES HOG UPDATE: Live hog futures closed higher again today with May and July bellies limit up. April hogs settled 93 points higher, closing at \$.5410, while May closed up 103 and settled at \$.5190.
