LOWER AS CARCASS BEEF PRICES WERE WEAK TO \$100 LOWER COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS AND THE MIDWEST WERE MOSTLY STEADY TO \$200 LOWER ALTHOUGH MOSTLY STEADY TO \$2 00 LOWER ALTHOUGH SOME LOCAL SALES WERE AS MUCH AS \$3 00 HIGHER COWS BEEF RANGED STEADY TO \$2 00 LOWER THE BOXED BEEF CUT-OUT VALUE TUESDAY WAS \$109 73/CWT THAT'S 39 CENT LOWER THAN LAST WEEK BEEF PRODUCTION LAST WEEK WAS 6 PERCENT ABOVE THE PREVIOUS WEEK BUT 5 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO WHEN AVERAGE WEIGHTS WERE 18 LBS HEAVIER VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS HELD STEADY WHILE EAST COAST CARCASS PRICES WERE


