

## Angus Bulls Tie For Top Price In NY Bull Test Sale

ITHACA, N.Y. - Two Angus bulls topped the 1987 New York Performance Tested Bull Sale May 1 at the Livestock Pavilion on the Cornell campus, selling for \$2,800 each.

The 46 performance tested bulls in the sale grossed \$64,000 for a sale average of \$1,391, the second highest sale average in the past five years and more than \$200 higher than the 1986 sale average.

Rally RF Conrail, 446, a son of SS Rising Sun 64R, consigned by Richrose Farm of Millbrook was one of the two sale toppers. He also was the top indexing British breed bull on the 140 test with a weight per day of age of 3.44 and average daily gain on test of 4.42 pounds. The buyer at \$2,800 was John Russell of Westtown.

Ballantree AT&T, a son of Pine Drive Big Sky, consigned by

Ballantree Farm of Westfield shared the top sale honors. The buyer at \$2,800 was ShiRaLoKen Farm of Deposit.

The 12 Angus bulls in the sale grossed \$21,775 for the highest breed average of \$1,814. The second highest selling Angus was a Culvert Brook Farm of Hamilton bull, C.B. Big Sky Lad 1086, a son of Pine Drive Big Sky. The buyer at \$2,400 was Coach Farm of Pine Plains.

The second highest selling bull in the fast-paced sale that played to a full house was a Simmental consignment from Hudson Pines Farm of Tarrytown. This bull, HPF Mister KI Clean U022, a son of HP Keep It Clean 660K, was purchased for \$2,600 by Cornell University. Cornell also purchased the second high selling Simmental, SBF Bud's Boy, a son of Switz Pol

Big Bud, consigned by ShagBrook Farm of Olean. The 11 Simmentals in the sale averaged \$1,288.

Another of the top selling bulls was the Charolais bull, Meadow View Mohawk, son of Shults Tornado Poll, consigned by Meadow View Farm of Frankfort. The buyer at \$1,900 was Maynard Hall of Penn Yan. The three Charolais bulls in the sale averaged \$1,308.

The two Red Angus bulls, both

Cornell University consignments, averaged \$1,550. The top seller was High Time Kent, a son of Leachman, Stamina 3928 and the buyer at \$1,700 was Don Werth of Cohocton.

The four Shorthorn bulls averaged \$1,250 with the top selling bull, Stony Brook Sultan 8614, a son of HCF Sultan SF, selling at \$1,500 to Mike Locke of Homer. Stony Brook Farms of Locke was the consignor.

The 14 Polled Hereford bulls in the sale averaged \$1,144 with the top selling bull, VVF Key Planner 157 consigned by Sapp-Valley View Farm of Buchanan, W. Va. This son of PS Key Play 402 was purchased at \$1,650 by Gordon Rowley of Livonia.

John Spiker of West Virginia was the auctioneer and buyers were present from Pennsylvania, Vermont, Maine, and Connecticut as well as from all sections of New York State.

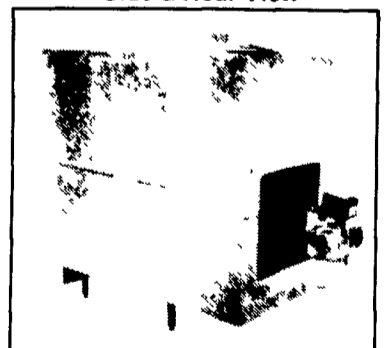
