delmonico steaks, barbecue, chicken, crab cakes, pit beef, pies, cakes and desserts, including an all-chocolate stand and much


The program will also feature demonstrations of farm related machinery and an amateur radio club for broadcasting from the museum. The mansion house will be open for tours given by costumed guides.
