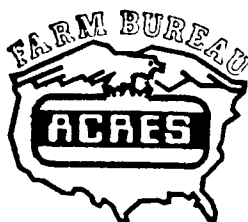

FUTURES MARKET TRENDS GRAIN AND LIVESTOCK

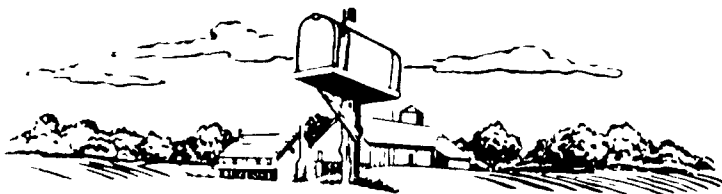
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ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures settled sharply higher and near the day's highs supported by rumors that the Soviets might be interested in making a 1.0 MMT purchase. Short covering in advance of the upcoming 3-day weekend was also supportive to the trade. Paring further gains were the lowerprecious metals and foreign currency futures. Generic certificates are steady at 105-106.50%.

ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybean settled sharply higher near session highs on heavy professional buying. During the session rumors that a Brazilian processor had defaultJ?P?K meal that this could happen again. Rumors also circulated that the Soviets were interested in US corn and meal which added to the bullish tone. It looks like the weather related losses are behind us for this week.

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures settled mixed in a directionless trading day with no fresh fundamentals. Casting a bearish tone to todays trading session were the lower precious metals and foreign currency markets. Bullishness came from ideas that the Soviets might be interested in futher purchases of
