Breasts, skinned, boneless 1.75. Rib-on-breasts .78-.80. Line run breasts .70. Legs .42-.44. Leg quarters .34-.36. Wings .45-.46. Backs and necks .11-.12. Livers .15-.20. Gizzards (hearts) .15-.20.

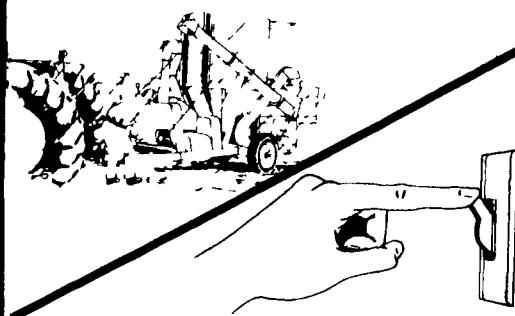

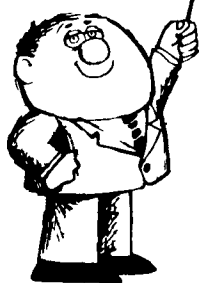
