#### Toy Selection

MEDIA - Matching toys with children is hard. Most of us know the feeling of buying the 'perfect'' toy and then watching it collect dust at the bottom of the toy chest. Delaware County Cooperative Extension economist home Maryetta Dorricott says it is often not the selection that is wrong, but the timing.

Sometimes children ignore toys because thev're too com-

plicated.. the child is too young to enjoy it. If this happens, just put the toy away until the child is ready for it. This way it stays in good condition.

On the other hand, a child may be too old for a toy.. the toy is too simple to capture the child's interest. The answer here is to give the toy away. But, wait a while... and let the child help decide who gets the toy.
