Slaughter bulls \$1.00-\$2.00 lower. Slaughter cattle demand moderate. Soaking rains throughout trade territory followed by two to eight inches Wednesday, results flooding, roads closed.

Movement of livestock has been hampered, effects expected to last for several days. This was a holiday shortened week with only two cattle auction days. Receipts this week 13,456 head; last week 27,056; last year 15,500. Feeder steers and heifers 95% of supply (93% of these yearlings). Cows and bulls 5% of run. » FUTURES MARKET TRENDS GRAIN AND LIVESTOCK

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ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybeans settled higher on strength in meal caused by late commission house buying. Cash movement is slow as farmers wait for another rally beforeselling. Gains in meal was attributed to strong commercial buying and meal/oil spreading linked with upcoming export business and rumors of more in the works.

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat settled slightly lower with declines limited by late buying in sympathy with a rally in beans. Lower than expected in export inspections cast a barish tone in wheat but was countered by continued trade hopes for a US bonus export to China.

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Live cattle and feeder cattle futures settled lower pressured by commercial selling late in the session. Buying interest was used up early on sharply higher openings. Higher openings were fueled by sharply higher beef cutout values and active fed cattle trade at higher prices on Tuesday.

ACRES HOG UPDATE: Hog futures posted new highs again today with spillover strength from the belly pit where July and Aug. closed limit-up. Continued tight cash supplies and technical support fueled gains in both pits.

ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures settled slightly higher with December widening its premium to July with commercial shortcovering and bare spreading. Old crop corn rallied mid-session due to light movement. 135 million dollars in generic certificates could come with the wheat disaster bill to be decided on tonight by President Regan.



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
