WEEKLY REVIEW IN VIRGINIA MARKETS IN REVIEW, MAY 21-27, 1987 FEEDER CATTLE IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS AND THE MIDWEST WERE STEADY TO \$3.00 LOWER WHILE PRICES WERE STRONGER FOR SLAUGHTER CATTLE AND CARCASS BEEF WHICH MOVED STEADY TO \$2.00 HIGHER THE BOXED BEEF CUT-OUT VALUE OF CHOICE 23, 550 700 LB CARCASSES REACHED \$116.45/CWT TUESDAY THIS WAS \$3.98 HIGHER THAN LAST TUESDAY BEEF PRODUCTION LAST WEEK WAS 1 PERCENT ABOVE THE PREVIOUS WEEK BUT 5 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO WHEN LIVE WEIGHTS WERE 5 LBS HEAVIER COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS AND THE MIDWEST MOVED STEADY TO \$2.00 LOWER AS LIMITED SALES OF COW BEEF WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 LOWER VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS FOLLOWED EAST COAST CARCASS PRICES STEADY TO \$4.00 HIGHER SLAUGHTER LAST WEEK WAS UNCHANGED FROM THE PREVIOUS WEEK BUT 24 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO WHEN AVERAGE WEIGHTS WERE 5 LBS HEAVIER LAMB PRICES AT VIRGINIA AUCTIONS WERE STEADY TO \$4.00 LOWER WHILE MIDWEST PRICES HELD STEADY EAST COAST CARCASS PRICES WERE

MOSTLY STEADY SLAUGHTER WAS 10 PERCENT ABOVE THE PREVIOUS WEEK, HOWEVER IT WAS DOWN 5 PERCENT FROM A YEAR AGO AS AVERAGE WEIGHTS WERE NEARLY UNCHANGED HOG PRICES AT VIRGINIA AUCTIONS AND THE MIDWEST WERE UNEVEN RANGING FROM \$1.00 LOWER TO \$1.00 HIGHER PORK PRODUCT PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$6.00 HIGHER ON LOINS AND STEADY TO \$3.00 LOWER ON HAMS AND BELLIES PORK PRODUCTION LAST WEEK WAS 1 PERCENT BELOW THE PREVIOUS WEEK AND 6 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO WITH AVERAGE WEIGHTS ONLY SLIGHTLY HEAVIER RICHMOND HOG MARKET CLOSED 50 CENT TO \$1.00 HIGHER THAN LAST WEDNESDAY WITH BARROWS AND GILTS 1 4, 200-240 LBS AT \$56.00-56.50/CWT TOTAL RECEIPTS FOR THE WEEK 287 HEAD THE SOUTHEAST VIRGINIA HOG MARKET CLOSED 50 CENT TO \$1.00 HIGHER THAN LAST WEDNESDAY WITH BARROWS AND GILTS 1 4 200-240 LBS AT \$56.00-58.00/CWT TOTAL RECEIPTS 10,124 HEAD
