ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Live cattle futures settled from unchanged to slightly higher on improved boxed beef movement and steady to higher fed cattle prices. Profit taking on the close brought prices down from session highs. Feeder cattle closed mixed but virtually unchanged from

yesterday's closes with the June option retaining pricing strength relative to the deferreds.

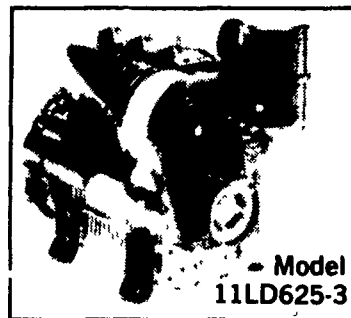
