## FUTURES MARKET TRENDS GRAIN AND LIVESTOCK

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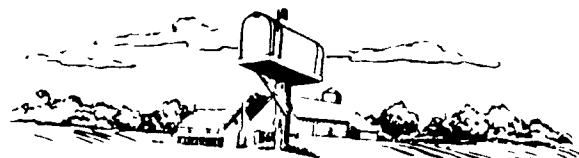
**ACRES CORN UPDATE:** Corn futures settled lower after a dull session, with traders liquidating on ideas of excellent growing conditions. Forecasts for rain throughout the weekend dictated today's activity as well as yesterday's unchanged carryout figures for 1986/87 on the USDA Supply and demand report. PIK and Roll is gaining momentum with premiums quoted at 106% to 107%.

**ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE:** Soybeans closed higher today from 1-3/4 cents in the front months to 4 cents in the deferreds spurred on by spillover strength in the soy meal pit. Soy meal strength was based on stronger European and Brazilian markets and renewed rumors of possible Soviet purchases or soypellets or soymeal. Bolstering new crop was talk of drier weather returning to the belt this weekend and doubts about the

coverage of current shower activity.

**ACRES WHEAT UPDATE:** Wheat futures settled higher again today in another dull session with buying on followthrough from yesterdays stronger close. The export rumors are still running rampant but further gains were trimmed by the soft red mid-western harvest and lower

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
