A business meeting followed and reports were given. The group plans to visit Longwood Gardens July 30.



President Janet Horn led devotions by reading St. John, chapter 1, verses 1 to 12.


During the business meeting, members discussed items from the June County Board meeting and made plans for the Shippensburg Fair, where the group has a food stand.


