Second high lactation was completed by a registered Holstein cow owned by Ferrell Farm, Bainbridge. No. 23 produced 32,276 pounds of milk, 1,099 pounds of fat with a 3.4 percent test, in 305 days.

### Eggs Up In April

**HARRISBURG** — April 1987 egg production in Pennsylvania totaled 408 million eggs, up seven percent from last April according to the Pennsylvania Agricultural Statistics Service.

The average number of layers on hand during April was 18.7 million, up five percent from a year earlier. Egg production per 100 layers was 2,185 compared with 2,138 during April 1986.

Laying flocks in the 20 major egg states produced 4.85 billion eggs during April 1987, up three percent from a year ago. The total number of layers during April averaged 233 million, up from 230 million last year. Egg production per 100 layers was 2,079 eggs, compared with 2,049 in 1986.
