Dauphin Co. Woman Wins Pa. Beef Cook-Off

HARRISBURG - A Dauphin County woman bested nine other contestants in the kitchen to win the Pennsylvania Beef Cook-Off, held recently at Trinity High School in Shiremanstown.

Debbie Yandric of Middletown captured first-place honors in the state contest and the right to represent Pennsylvania in national competition with her recipe, "Best Dressed Beef Salad."

Yandric and the nine other state

finalists prepared their dishes in the home economic kitchen of the high school while the contest's four judges waited to sample the results.

After tasting each of the dishes, the panel singled out Yandric's dish as best and awarded her the \$150 top prize. Second place went to Judy Reynolds of Edinboro and her "J.R.'s Tex Mex Beef Rolls."

Vincent C. Gentilcore of Bethlehem, one of two men in the competition, won third place with his "Four Star Flank Steak," and Josephine R. Piro of Easton placed fourth with "Oriental Steak Pockets."

Yandrıc will prepare her winning recipe next in the National Beef Cook-Off at Sun Valley, Idaho, Sept. 21 to 23, where she will compete with other state champions. In the past 10 years, Pennsylvania Cook-Off winners have captured three national titles.

Judges for Monday's competition were Betty Rode of Harrisburg, a former coordinator of the state contest; Connie Bramson, food editor of the Harrisburg Patriot-News newspapers; Jerry Heinze of Boiling Springs, owner of the Allenberry Resort; and Paul Bakker, food show host for WHP Radio Station.
