COMMENT: TRADING ACTIVITY WAS LIGHT TO FAIR, BUT REMAINED SELECTIVE. CUTLETS WERE CLEARING REASONABLY WELL AND WHILE \$1.75 WAS HARD TO COME BY, MOST SELLERS FOUND NO NEED TO TAKE LESS THAN \$1.70 TODAY. LINE RUN BREASTS WERE SPOTTY, BUT THRE INQUIRY HAD SHOWN SOME IMPROVEMENT AT 75 CENT. RIB BREASTS WERE ADEQU-ATE TO FULLY ADEQUATE BUT HAVE BECOME MORE NEGOTIABLE LEGS AND LEG QUARTER REMAINED AMPLE FOR IMMEDIATE SHIPMENT, BUT WERE CLEARING A LITTLE BIT BETTER AT THE LOWER PRICE LEVELS. WINGS WERE TIGHT AND CLEARANCES WERE NO PROBLEM.


