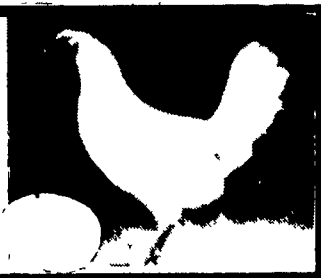

MOVEMENT OF READY-TO-COOK WHOLE BIRDS WAS MODERATE OVERALL AND SUFFICIENT TO KEEP OFFERINGS IN GOOD BALANCE. WINGS CONTINUED TO CLEAR WELL AT HIGHER TRENDING PRICES. ALL OTHER PARTS WERE TRADING AT LOWER PRICES, PARTICULARLY LEGS AND LEG QUARTERS WHICH WERE ATTRACTING INCREASED INTEREST AT THE LOWER LEVELS LESS THAN TRUCKLOT ASKING PRICES WERE UNCHANGED AT 48 TO 59 CENTS LIVE SUPPLIES WERE MODERATE AT MIXED BUT GENERALLY DESIRABLE WEIGHTS SOME CONCERN WAS NOTED THAT HIGH TEMPERATURES AND HUMIDITY WAS FORCAST FOR A PROLONGED PERIOD SLAUGHTER SCHEDULES WERE MODERATELY HEAVY. THE UNDERTONE WAS ABOUT STEADY

MARKET COMMENT: EXTRA LARGE AND LARGE PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO LOWER, MEDIUM UNCHANGED THE MARKET TONE WAS BARELY STEADY TO STEADY FOR LARGE AND STEADY FOR MEDIUMS. DEMAND FOR CARTON EGGS WERE OCCASIONALLY QUIET TO MODERATE WITH GOOD DEMAND INTO FOOD SERVICE CHANNELS AND VACATION AREAS SUPPLIES OF EXTRA LARGE WERE ADEQUATE AND MORE AVAILABLE, LARGE WERE ADEQUATE TO AMPLE, WHILE MEDIUM WERE ADEQUATE TO FULLY ADEQUATE AND IN A CLOSER BALANCE.

COMMENT: TRADING ACTIVITY WAS LIGHT TO FAIR, BUT REMAINED SELECTIVE. CUTLETS WERE CLEARING REASONABLY WELL AND WHILE \$1.75 WAS HARD TO COMEBY, MOST SELLERS FOUND NO NEED TO TAKE LESS THAN \$1.70 TODAY. LINE RUN BREASTS WERE SPOTTY, BUT THRE INQUIRY HAD SHOWN SOME IMPROVEMENT AT 75 CENT. RIB BREASTS WERE ADEQUATE TO FULLY ADEQUATE BUT HAVE BECOME MORE NEGOTIABLE LEGS AND LEG QUARTER REMAINED AMPLE FOR IMMEDIATE SHIPMENT, BUT WERE CLEARING A LITTLE BIT BETTER AT THE LOWER PRICE LEVELS. WINGS WERE TIGHT AND CLEARANCES WERE NO PROBLEM.
