Del. Field Day To Highlight Poultry Manure Management

NEWARK, Del.-A comprehensive survey of poultry manure management methods including collection, storage, nutrient sampling and crop application will be part of Farm and Home Field Day, Wednesday, Aug. 12, at the University of Delaware Research and Education Center near Georgetown.

"We expect to present the total picture in about two hours," says Dan Palmer, extension poultry specialist and coordinator of this event. "In addition, Sussex County farmers who attend the sessions

from 10 a.m. to noon will meet the educational requirements needed to apply for a poultry-manure barn, cost-share program."

A representative from the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service will be present at Field Day to discuss this cost-share plan, which requires a sign-off by Delaware Cooperative Extension.

The poultry manure management program will begin at 10 a.m. with an introduction by J. Ross Harris Jr., extension specialist on environmental quality. A 20-mi-

nute slide presentation of the effects of poultry manure on irrigated corn will then be presented by soil scientist Dr. J. Thomas Sims, director of the university's soil laboratory. Mark Isaacs, university crop research associate, will then present a brief slide show on the effects of poultry manure on winter wheat.

Harris will give the final slide presentation from 10:40 a.m. to 11 a.m. His subject will be the MAN-URE program. The title is an acronym for "Managing Agricultural Nutrients and Utilitizing Resources Effectively.'

An outdoor tour will follow the slide presentations. Participants can visit six demonstration plots in which irrigated corn was treated with different amounts of poultry manure, both alone and in combination with commercial fertilizers.

Proper poultry manure storage methods will be demonstrated next. Participants will learn how to

stack and shape a manure pile and how to cover it properly. Isaacs will then show how to sample the piles for nitrogen and other nutrients to determine the necessary application rates.

The program will end with a demonstration of proper spreader calibration from 11:30 a.m. to 11:55 a.m.
